On Thursday, February 23rd, seventy-nine 7th and 8th grade band students had the opportunity of a lifetime to perform alongside the worldfamous Dallas Brass. During the school day, students were bused over to LBHS to rehearse and clinic with the LBHS band and the professional brass sextet. Students learned proper audience and stage etiquette, worked on their musical selection to be performed later in the evening, and discovered and discussed what a career as a professional musician looks like.

Later that evening, students and their families enjoyed a tremendously entertaining performance by the Dallas Brass, performed a cool disco version of Star Wars, and watched the LBHS band perform an American medley.

MPA Update

MPA stands for "Music Performance Assessment". In the months of February and early March, our 8th graders (and some 7th graders) attended the three MPA events listed below. The judges at these events are experienced professional musicians that grade the students' performance. Using a music rubric, the judge's grade and then afterwards average the scores for an overall rating. The ratings include: "Superior" = A, "Excellent" = B, "Good" = C, "Fair" = D, and "Poor" = F. Students are judged on fundamentals, technical accuracy and musicality.

- We had 55 students participate in Solo and Ensemble and <u>all</u> of them earned a "Superior" or "A" rating.
- We had 27 students participate in Jazz MPA and the Jazz Band earned straight "Superior" or "A" ratings.
- We had 57 students participate in Concert Band MPA and the Advanced Band earned straight "Superior" or "A" ratings from all three stage judges as well as the sight-reading judge.
- With this year's assessment achievements, at the state music convention in January 2024, Mr. Ostrow will be receiving a third "Five-Year Superior Award" to bring back to Ainger.
- Congratulations to our AMAZING student musicians for another great year at MPA's!


