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Why Music?

Music is a Science. It is exact, specific, and it demands exact acoustics. A conductor's full score is a chart; a graph which indicates frequencies, intensities, volume changes, melody, and harmony all at once and with the most exact control of time.

Music is Physical Education. It requires fantastic coordination of fingers, hands, arms, lip, cheek, and facial muscles in addition to extraordinary control of the diaphragmatic, back, stomach, and chest muscles, which respond instantly to the sound the ear hears and the mind interprets.

Music develops insight and demands research.

Music is all these things, but most of all, Music is a **Fine Out**. It allows a human being to take all these techniques and apply them to create emotion. That is one thing science cannot duplicate; humanism, feeling, and emotion.

Director's Welcome

Welcome to L.A. Ainger's annual Spring Concert! If you have not attended an Ainger concert before, you are in for a special treat. The students know me as Mr. Ostrow. I have been teaching at Ainger for **SIXTEEN** years and I'm very proud of our tradition of excellence in student achievement and performance. Ainger is a top performing school that enjoys continued support from the greater Englewood area.

For all guests, we ask that proper audience etiquette is adhered to for the full duration of the program. Please remain seated while the bands are performing, no flash photography *during* a performance, no food or drinks in the auditorium, and keep applause polite. Please also remember that our young musicians have worked especially hard preparing tonight's performance and in order to listen, silence is required. We also ask that our families and friends stay for the duration of the entire program.

Our 7th and 8th grade **Jazz Band** is by far the busiest ensemble at Ainger. These students have learned a variety of styles including swing, blues, Latin, funk and rock in one year. In February, this group performed at the annual Music Performance Assessment and earned straight superior ratings from all three judges! In March, these students were our ambassadors who performed alongside our beginning band for our rising fifth graders. In late March, our jazz band also performed alongside the LBHS "Swinging Rays" in the Boca Grand Woman's Club Parade. At the conclusion of the parade, they played the National Anthem! You will be blown away with what our students have learned in one year!

Thus far, the **Beginning Band** members have worked hard this final semester and have learned to play 11 notes with a great tone, simple rhythmic patterns, three time signatures, the concepts of blend and balance, basic articulations, dynamics, and all have developed their listening skills in tuning and blending exercises. These students are now ready to join the Intermediate and Advanced Bands and some will be joining Jazz Band and Percussion Ensemble. Students that are playing french horn and tuba switched over from their "core" instrument in early January. Next year, some of our woodwind players will be switching to double reeds and saxophone.

Intermediate Band members this semester have learned to play seven major scales. They have also learned to read difficult beat patterns including single eighths and syncopated and tied rhythms. Their overall sound has improved vastly since August. The music they are playing tonight will have many different parts (polyphony) that require a deeper understanding of balance and blend. You will hear a more refined performance from our advancing ensemble of mostly seventh graders.

Advanced Band members have been extending their range through multiple octave scales, rhythms including sixteenth and triplet beat patterns, and performing more refined articulations with a rich ensemble blend and balance. This band also performed in a split woodwind and brass choir in February earning an astounding all superior ratings. This impressive ensemble performed for the annual "Music Performance Assessment" on March 9th and earned "Superior" ratings from all three judges and the sight reading judge!
